Some Happenings for the Town...

- 1) The number one concern I hear is about our roads! I agree! Did you know that large trucks are a major contributor to damaging our roads? We currently have over 5 different trash companies coming on various days of the week each stopping and starting numerous times. One truck can service 500 homes in a day. Therefore, I contacted six solid waste vendors to meet to provide competitive offers for service to our area which can be a lower cost for YOU and provide needed revenue for OUR town and mean fewer trucks! A win-win for Poetry!
- 2) Until we have a designated town attorney, we cannot negotiate roads to any significant degree with the counties. The town council probably



needs to vote that person in at the first Town Hall meeting. The first time we could all get together was June 15th.

3) We have the town mailbox installed... service is coming soon! Paperwork

submitted!

- 4) Sheetrock and three interior doors installed at Town Hall! 5) Completed Texas Open Meetings and Public Information Act Training. 6) Signed up for our FREE year with Texas Municipal League for our town and each of our councilmembers.
- 7) Discussed hours of information with attorneys for proper procedures.
- 8) Submitted paperwork for our Town Insurance-- out for underwriting process.
- 9) Requested land appraisal values from both Hunt and Kaufman Counties. Received preliminary values from Hunt County.
- 10) Assisted Oncor, FEC and Nextlink with items needed to process franchise fees.
- 11) Working on forms for Emergency Medical Services with potential appointments.
